Asunción & Hohenau, Paraguay Medical Mission Trip

Trip Purpose

AdventHealth volunteers will provide primary care outpatient services and health education to the people of Asunción and several Paraguayan villages in the Hohenau area during clinic days.

Location & Culture

Paraguay, located in the heart of South America, is a captivating country that boasts a rich cultural heritage and diverse landscapes. Amidst its many cities, Asunción is the capital city of Paraguay, bordered by the Paraguay River. Asunción is the principal distributing center of the most densely populated region of Paraguay. Paraguayan culture is deeply rooted in indigenous Guarani traditions, blending harmoniously with Spanish influences. This fusion is evident in Asunción, where visitors can witness traditional crafts, lively festivals, and flavorful cuisine that showcase the country's cultural tapestry.

As a developing country, Paraguay faces various challenges in healthcare. However, efforts have been made to improve the healthcare system, throughout the country. Basic healthcare services are available, although access and quality may vary in remote regions. The government is actively working to enhance healthcare infrastructure and ensure equitable access to medical services across the country.

The official languages of Paraguay are Spanish and Guarani, reflecting the country's linguistic diversity. Guarani, an indigenous language, is widely spoken alongside Spanish and is an integral part of Paraguay's cultural identity.



Sanatorio Adventista de Asunción and Sanatorio Adventista de Hohenau



are part of AdventHealth's Global Missions program. We have established a working relationship with these two hospitals since 2022. We will work alongside healthcare professionals from both Sanatorio Adventista de Asunción and Sanatorio Adventista de Hohenau during clinic days. These hospitals are affiliated with the Seventh-day Adventist



church and serve their communities with in-patient hospitalization, operating rooms, outpatient visits and medical care from physicians specializing in various areas of medicine.

Requirements for Participation:

1. **Valid passport**, with an expiration date of at least six months after the dates of intended travel.

We recommend that you keep a copy of your passport with you at all times while traveling through Paraguay. For U.S. and Canadian citizens, no visa is necessary for our visit to Paraguay.

If you are not a U.S./Canadian citizen, please contact the Global Missions office for additional assistance regarding visa requirements for entry into Paraguay.

Health and Safety Protocol as established by AdventHealth Global Missions

The safety and health of our volunteer team and security within our destination/host country is of utmost priority. Any volunteer wanting to travel on an AdventHealth Global Missions' trip must:

- ☐ Adhere to the vaccine requirements of our host country and our host institution, including covid testing if required. If our host country or institution require COVID vaccination or testing for entry into the country or for healthcare workers, then you must meet those vaccination requirements against the COVID-19 virus.
Current situation (subject to change): We are **not** requiring volunteers to be vaccinated with the COVID vaccine in order to participate on this mission trip.
- ☐ Agree to wear a mask at all appropriate times as instructed by the team leader. This includes but is not limited to properly masked in airports, team meetings, morning and afternoon commute on the bus and during clinic hours.

Weather and Atmosphere

Seasons in the Southern Hemisphere are opposite to those in the Northern Hemisphere. We will be visiting Paraguay during the spring season. The climate is pleasant in that locality this month. Temperatures are up to 91°F. The minimum is 70°F. Thus, the mean temperature average in March in Asunción is 83°F. Also expect rain, as it is the rainy season in Paraguay.

Food and Drink

Paraguay's cuisine is influenced by its indigenous Guarani roots and Spanish heritage. Traditional dishes include chipa, a cheesy bread; sopa paraguaya, a cornbread with onions and

cheese; and asado, grilled meats. Tereré, a refreshing cold herbal tea, and cocido, a hot infusion, are popular beverages. Yerba mate is also widely enjoyed throughout the country.

We recommend only consuming food that is provided to you by our hosts.

Water

We recommend you do not drink tap water, only bottled water.

This may include brushing your teeth and ordering drinks with ice. You will be provided bottled water throughout the trip.

Lodging

We will be staying at different hotels throughout our stay. The hotel room assignment will be 2 people per room based upon gender or couples.

Immunizations

The Yellow Fever Vaccine is a requirement for participation on this mission trip. For more information, please visit [Yellow Fever Vaccine | Yellow Fever Virus | CDC](#).

We recommend our participants are up-to-date on routine vaccines before every trip, including the covid vaccine and yearly flu shot.

Routine vaccines include measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine, diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis vaccine, varicella (chickenpox) vaccine, and polio vaccine. More information on recommended vaccinations is available at <https://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/destinations/list/>

Miscellaneous

Foreign Currency

The Guaraní (PYG) is the official currency of Paraguay. 1 USD is equivalent to 7,872 PYG as of Jan. 2025.

How much money should you bring?

The only money you will need is for any extra food and souvenirs you may want to purchase. Most everything you see in shops or from vendors will be less expensive than in the USA. Bargaining of prices for goods may be appropriate for street vendors.

You may also bring cash to tip the hotel staff if applicable.

Electricity

In Paraguay the electrical power is 220v at 50 cycles. If your electrical device *ONLY* allows 110v, then you will need a voltage convertor.

Some outlets will be two round pins (shown here) instead of the outlets used in the U.S. In order to use your devices, you will need a plug adapter.



If your electrical device uses a 3-prong outlet, make sure that you purchase an adapter like the one shown below.



These are available at stores or online, typically in the travel section.

Cell phone and Internet Access

If you need cell phone access, please make arrangements with your cell phone carrier prior to departure. Wi-Fi access may be available at the hotel.

Important Travel Tips

- Please do not go out on the streets by yourself, always in a group.
- Respect others; **always be on time for scheduled events** (better early than late).
- Remember: You are a guest in Paraguay, the rules and cultural norms may be different and more conservative.

Packing Tips:

- Be a minimalist, don't over pack.
- Nights and mornings are colder, pack warm sleepwear and sweaters.

- Dress in layers to accommodate changing weather throughout the day especially for rain.
- Personal Medications: Bring what you would normally travel with and include items such as headache and anti-diarrhea medicine, Zofran, Cipro, etc.
- Scrubs are optional, on clinic days you can wear pants and a polo shirt or t-shirts that have the AdventHealth logo.
- Please leave jewelry back in the U.S. and dress conservatively – no loud shirts, pants, shorts, etc.

Luggage Allowance

- 1 – checked luggage. Weight limit is 23 kg/50 lbs. Cost will be covered by Global Missions.
- 1 – personal item brought onto the plane, should be able to fit under the seat in front of you.
